The WHY:

Every year, Virginia undergoes an election, opening up a chance for abortion extremism to make its way back into Virginia politics. This November, we again face that chance. **7 in 10 Americans** want limits on abortion. It's imperative that we elect leaders who will stand for Life in law. Talking Points and Sources:

- In 2019, an extreme Virginia delegate <u>proposed a bill</u> that would allow abortion up until birth, that same week she proposed <u>a bill to protect endangered butterflies</u>.
 After learning more about the bill, 22 of the co-sponsors publicly repudiated their sponsorship.
- A fetus <u>can feel pain at 15 weeks</u> and that a preborn child is viable around 22 weeks of pregnancy. Learn more about fetal development here.
- Former Governor Northam once callously talked about infanticide:
 - o "The infant would be delivered...[and] would be resuscitated IF that's what the mother and the family desired."
- Regardless of your position on abortion, infanticide should be universally agreed upon as wrong.
- In the short time that pro-abortion legislators had a majority in office, they went against 78% of Americans by making abortion legal after a fetus can feel pain.
- A fetus can feel pain at 15 weeks and that a preborn child is viable around 22 weeks of pregnancy. Learn more about fetal development here.
- In Virginia, former Governor Northam and VA <u>lawmakers voted to repeal health and safety standards</u> such as an ultrasound requirement and waiting period before having an abortion in 2020. They also advocated for non-physicians to perform abortions.
- Women deserve laws that protect their informed consent and that hold abortion facilities to at least the same standards as nail salons (<u>in New York, nail salons are</u> <u>inspected more than abortion facilities</u>). Inspections and safety standards matter as they protect women from serious injury and/or death. In Pennsylvania, abortionist Kermit Gosnell was convicted of killing a woman through medical malpractice. His clinic was <u>uninspected for 17 years</u>.
- Bottom Line: If these laws/positions are too extreme for you, tell your legislators with your vote.

- Pro-abortion legislators pass laws that hurt women and preborn children and repeal laws that protect them.
- Vote for legislators that oppose abortion extremism. Encourage people to commit to voting against abortion extremism at **TooExtremeforMe.org**.
