Do **NOT** Support the *Right to IVF Act*

Dear Members of the U.S. Senate,

On behalf of our more than 1,400 active groups and 200,000 trained student activists across the nation, *Students for Life Action* urges you to **NOT support the Right to IVF Act (S. 4445)**.

Again, Senator Schumer wants to force a 2<sup>nd</sup> vote on the bad *Right to IVF Act*. We want to remind Senate members that this bill is still just as dangerous and would allow reproductive technology to grow past the already unethical boundaries it has crossed, making it a federal right to enable the following:


- Gene editing
- Sex selection
- Human cloning
- Making human-animal chimeras
- Reproducing children of a parent who is long deceased
- Engaging in the buying and selling of human embryos
- Commercial gestational surrogacy

[As Students for Life of America has written:](#) “The IVF industry is poorly regulated and too rarely monitored, with numerous media stories illustrating problems ... **OUR PRIMARY CONCERN: Forcing fertilization in bulk to facilitate just a few births, with those not chosen facing a terrible end.** Because of the cost of IVF, and the fact that “**the vast majority of embryos (80%) produced during IVF and chosen for transfer still fail to implant or to result in a liveborn infant**”, IVF businesses will attempt to create human embryos in volume.” The business model, by definition, creates disposable children, which is concerning to many.
