



## Hearing Request for the *Clean Water for All Life Act* [H.R. 7983](#)

Dear Chairman Jim Jordan and Members of the House Judiciary Committee,

Students for Life Action (SFLAction), on behalf of our more than 1,700 student groups and more than 250,000 trained activists operating in all 50 states, **calls on the House Judiciary Committee to hold a hearing on the *Clean Water for All Life Act* [H.R. 7983](#) introduced by Rep. Mary Miller (R-IL).** This bill would require the use of biohazard catch kits during Chemical Abortions and hold chemical abortion pill vendors accountable for waterway contamination from abortion water pollution.

As a result of changes the Biden Administration made to how Chemical Abortion Pills can be distributed – by mail and without health & safety guardrails for mothers – [more than 50 tons of chemically tainted blood and placenta tissue, along with human remains](#), goes into our waterways every year, if you believe the Guttmacher Institute math that more than 6 in 10 abortions are committed with pills. Looking at the illegal Chemical Abortion Pill trafficking market and data from other countries, we believe it's much higher. This creates risks to those who want crystal clear drinking water, untainted by abortion water pollution.

Even if you support abortion, that's not an argument in favor of a de facto right to dump pathological medical waste; something hospitals and out-patient medical clinics are not allowed to do. As the [American Academy of Family Physicians](#) observes, "Home based health care can create medical waste which can be hazardous if not disposed properly."

In 2017, Students for Life began raising concerns about abortion water pollution, allowed by the reckless policies of three Democratic Party Presidents, who forced Chemical Abortion Pills on the market and then deregulated them. **Even if you support abortion, that doesn't mean you want to drink abortion water pollution.**

This is a human rights atrocity and an environmental crisis, caused by the greed of Chemical Abortion Pill pushers and negligent federal policy. With the frightening increase of infertility, miscarriage, and other health issues skyrocketing in our country, this risk is something that must not be overlooked.

Such a blocker may be causing widespread harm. Consider that at the end of 2024, *The New York Times* published this troubling headline: *Does the United States Have an Infertility Crisis?*, exploring historically low birthrates. Among the factors discussed was the difficulty of getting and staying pregnant.


In this unique moment, before the next election, the GOP in the U.S. House majority has the opportunity to shed light on the consequences of Democratic Party politics on the abortion issue with a hearing that examines environmental concerns. Students for Life has filed eight citizen petitions to the Food and Drug Administration (FDA), detailing such concerns, including to endangered species, exposed to such pollution. There is a broad, scientific framework for this.

This is, fundamentally, a bill that says abortion vendors should follow the law demanded of those doing real, life-affirming medical care. And it makes it clear that abortion water pollution is not acceptable to those wanting safe drinking water. We ask for a hearing to detail our concerns.
